A minimum of 120 credits (plus 1 PE credit) are required for this degree.

# 39 Upper Division Course Credits

Every UGA student must earn at least 39 hours of upper-division credits (numbered 3000 or above) to graduate. The B.S. in Psychology provides 22 hours of upper-division credit. Students should work with their advisor to plan for the additional 17 upper-division hours needed to reach 39.

# **Resident Requirement**

Candidates for first baccalaureate degrees who matriculate at UGA fall 2003 and thereafter must earn at least 45 of the last 60 semester credit hours in residence. In addition, 15 of the semester credit hours required for a student's major must be earned in residence. (Some majors may require more than the minimum of 15 semester credit hours.)

## **Advising Appointments**

It is required that you have a formal, scheduled advising appointment each semester. See <u>how to find your advisor and make an appointment in SAGE</u>.

### **DegreeWorks**

DegreeWorks is the system used to see the progress in your degree. To acquaint yourself with DegreeWorks, <u>view a brief tutorial</u> and then <u>sign in</u> using your MyID and password. It is your responsibility to review Degree Works and clarify the requirements with your advisor.

## **Minimum Grade Requirement**

BS Psychology requires a minimum grade of "C" in the following Area VI courses: BIOL 1103 or 1107, BIOL 1103L or 1107L, PSYC 1101, and STAT 2000 (or any other course to fulfill the statistics/math requirement in Area VI) and <u>all</u> of the courses in the Major requirements area of the DegreeWorks audit. <u>Complete details</u> available in the <u>Bulletin</u>.

# Sciences for the Psychology degree

The Bachelor of Science degree in Psychology requires four science courses. You need two life sciences with labs, one physical science with a lab, and one additional physical science course that doesn't require a lab. Psychology with a Neuroscience emphasis requires specific sciences. Discuss these with your advisor.

# **Permission of Department**

The Psychology Advising Office can only provide overrides or PODs for PSYC courses. Each department manages its own PODs, so students must contact the individual department that manages the course.
